

Articles of Incorporation - Statement of Faith

Business owners who wish to be prepared to assert a religious liberty defense to any law that burden religious liberty should, at a minimum, have a statement of faith in their articles of incorporation that specifies that:

The corporation's voting shareholder are adherents of the Christian faith and intend to operate the corporation not only for profit but also as a means of advancing and expressing their faith. In fact, their faith requires them to live their entire lives, including the decisions they make for their business, in obedience to their religious convictions. These exercises of faith in the decisions they make for their business include but are not limited to the desire to operate the corporation in accordance with and communicate what they believe to be the truth in terms of human sexuality, marriage, and the sanctity of life.
