AN INVITATION TO PRAYER AND FASTING

Dear Friends,

If 7:14 Prayer Initiative is calling an assembly of believers who are of a pure heart and clean hands to draw close to God in a time of prayer and fasting.

As we look at our present-day world, we see nations in turmoil and the very foundations of the earth being shaken. Biblical principles of good and evil are reversed and deep darkness prevails over the earth. As in the days of the Old Testament prophet Joel, we ask ourselves - has anything like this ever happened before? Hard days are at hand and the intensity of the fight against God's chosen ones intensifies.

The American church has lost much of her saltiness. In her quest to be relevant, she is no longer clothed in the holiness and righteousness of Christ (Galatians 3:27).

We invite you to join us July 1-14 in a time of prayer and fasting. Exalt! A Call to Prayer and Fasting consists of 14 days of prayer and 7 days of fasting. You are invited to choose any 7 days of the 14 to fast. You will also note that each day we are inviting you to exalt a name of Christ and pray for your communities using that name each of the 14 days. As your schedule allows add fasting for seven of the days. The article entitled Ready, Set, Go that follows this invitation to pray will provide you with helpful and practical ways to prepare yourself for a fast.

As we exalt the name of Jesus, we see Him high and lifted up, worthy of all our praise. We realize that he is the source of all our joy. He is the very treasure that we seek. We pray that our eyes will be fixed fully on him as we humble ourselves in complete dependence upon Him. "He must become greater and greater, and we must become less and less" (John 3:30).

Let us gather to fast and pray, to minister to God, to disconnect from the world, to enjoy His presence, and to be filled with the Spirit of Christ!

FOCUS PRAYER

Father, you are faithful and your love endures forever. We come to you in humility fully aware of our dependance on you alone! As we pray, let our hearts be focused on your goodness and greatness, so that our prayers align with your kingdom purposes for our families, our churches, our communities, and states. As we corporately take time to abide in the Word and pray the Word, may we offer kingdom prayers that make supplication according to your will.

As we seek your face, purify our hearts as we long to be holy! We ask that your Son might be exhibited within us in greater and greater measure so the world may know that you are the God who saves and heals and restores!

During this fast, I am praying and believing God for:

READY. SET. GO.

Jesus made it clear in the Sermon on the Mount that information without application is not very helpful. Only when the words and realities of the Bible are applied to our lives will we begin to see the world of Scripture come to life in us. I am convinced that God longs to do more than any of us could ever ask or imagine both in us and through us. But that sort of life will not come simply because we are more educated on the blessings of prayer and fasting. We must actually take action if we want to experience these blessings.

Description Vs. Prescription

Although the Bible often describes how people in the Bible would fast, it does not specifically prescribe how we as Jesus' followers should fast. Jesus deals with our motives but he does not address the mechanics of fasting.

What I'm getting ready to share is not a prescription for how you should fast; it's simply a description of several things that could help you step into a season of prayer and fasting more faithfully and effectively.

Four Primary Ways to Fast

Generally speaking, there are four common ways Christians choose to fast.

1. Major Fast

A major fast is when you abstain from food or drink for twenty-four consecutive hours or more. A major fast requires a certain level of physical health, and it is recommended that you check with your doctor if you're doing a major fast that lasts more than a few days in a row. Some examples from Scripture of a major fast can be found in Matthew 4:2, Acts 9:9, and Esther 4:15-16, just to name a few.

2. Minor Fast

In a minor fast, you choose to abstain from food for a certain period of time (i.e., 6 a.m. to 3 p.m. or sunup to sundown). This fast is sometimes called a "Jewish fast," and it can last for days at a time, eating only at a set time of the day. In a minor fast, most people will drink liquids during the day and have one small meal after sundown each evening.

READY. SET. GO.

3. Partial Fast

A partial fast is when you give up only certain foods during the course of your fast. This fast is seen most clearly in Daniel 1, where Daniel abstains from certain foods out of devotion to God for a period of time. During a partial fast, some people choose to give up certain foods they enjoy in an effort to turn their hearts more deeply toward God.

4. Soul Fast

Technically speaking, biblical fasting only refers to abstaining from food or drink (or both) for a spiritual purpose. However, some people choose to fast from things other than food. Some people will give up television, social media, or other activities for a soul fast to focus on prayer.

Each of these fasts can be a valuable way of connecting with God more deeply. If you are physically able, though, I would encourage you to prayerfully consider one of the first three fasts. There is something about giving up food that physically and spiritually realigns you in ways nothing else can.

Six Steps for Getting Started

Now that we discussed various types of fasts, let's look at some practical suggestions for starting well.

1. Set Your Objective

Begin by asking God to help you understand why you are fasting.

For which of these reasons are you fasting?

- o Spiritual renewal
- o Guidance from God
- o Discernment in a certain area of life
- o Physical healing
- o Revival of the church
- o Salvation of the lost
- o All of the above

As we humble ourselves in fasting and prayer before God, the Holy Spirit will often move us to pray for an awakening in our churches, healing in our land, and revival in our country and beyond. Allow the Lord to align your objectives with his objectives as you prepare to fast.

READY. SET. GO.

2. Choose Your Fast

Second, you need to make a few decisions:

What kind of fast will you do?

- Major Fast
- Minor Fast
- Partial Fast
- Soul Fast

How long will you be fasting?

- A partial day each week
- A full day each week
- Several consecutive days
- Several consecutive weeks
- Other: _____

With whom will you fast?

- Family/roommates
- House church/small group
- Friends
- Other

3. Prepare Yourself

Third, you need to give your mind, body, heart, and community the adequate time needed to prepare for your fast.

Your Mind

Fasting is just as much a mental exercise as it is physical. Begin asking the Lord to mentally prepare you for the journey you're about to take.

Your Body

No matter what kind of fast you're preparing for, it will require some adjustments for your body. I encourage you to drink plenty of water in the days leading up to your fast. It's also important to avoid the urge to overeat in the days leading up to your fast, which actually makes things more difficult once you begin your fast.

READY. SET. GO.

Your Heart

Remember, fasting is about your commitment to the Lord. I find it helpful to spend time in confession and repentance before entering a fast. I will often spend several days leading up to the fast asking God to forgive me of my sins, making sure I am in good standing with my brothers and sisters, and asking God to purify my motives as I enter into this time with him.

Your Community

Prepare your community of family and friends. I have found this to be deeply important, especially if you have people in your family or household who will not be fasting with you. Remember, fasting is about taking a break from food, not from people. I've fasted many times without our children participating. It's important for me to prepare them for what we're doing so that it doesn't disrupt their lives. I want them to view fasting as a blessing from God—not a terrible thing their parents endure from time to time. This takes intentional preparation on our part.

4. Make a Plan

Fourth, you need to make a plan to use the times usually given to eating as times of prayer, worship, and Bible study. When our family fasts, we use this time to pray, worship, and read the Bible together. When I'm fasting but my family is not, I use our family meal times to share what God is doing in my heart as the rest of the family eats. Either way, making a plan for how you will repurpose your meal times is very important.

5. Start it and Stick with it

Fifth, quite simply you will need to start your fast and stick with it if you're going to make any progress in this discipline. Chances are, especially if this is your first fast, you might not make it as long as you had intended. That's okay. When you're hungry, pray. If you break down and give in to hunger, pray. Either way, get back up and keep moving forward toward God.

Fasting is an exercise in grace—so make sure you give yourself some.

READY. SET. GO.

6. Share with Others

Finally, share both the burden and the blessing of fasting with a small community. Keep in mind how the Bible is clear that fasting is not something we do for the attention of other people. So be careful not to let everyone around you know that you're fasting because that can allow pride to creep in. But you can fall off the other side of the boat here, too. That's why I believe it's important to fast in community. I have often found that my most successful fasts have been the ones I did with a small group of trusted believers. We were able to daily share in the blessings that come from pursuing God more deeply together.

REFLECTION

May you call thousands upon thousands in these states to authentically engage in the greater work of prayer. We give you praise for including us in this greater work. We pray for a revived America that honors you and blesses people. May it begin - right here - right now! Amen.

EXALT CHRIST THE LORD OUR DELIVERER

"And in this way all Israel will be saved, as it is written, The Deliverer will come from Zion; he will turn godlessness away from Jacob." - Romans 11:26

REFLECTION

Some years ago while living in Louisiana, I recall that Hurricane Andrew roared through the Gulf Coast area wreaking havoc and destruction in its path. As in every post-hurricane environment, the natural disaster required thousands of rescues and deliverance. A lot of courage was displayed between neighbors and friends.

While stories of rescue and deliverance abound in such disasters, there is no greater deliverer, no more powerful rescuer, than Jesus Christ. Jesus came to earth on a rescue mission.

It is true that Jesus came to deliver us from our sins and bring us to salvation. That is the greatest deliverance ever in our lives. But we also know his deliverance touches every area of our lives.

Jesus can and will deliver us from loneliness, from sickness and obstacles. As a deliverer, he overpowers demons. Jesus is able to calm every storm you encounter and even deliver you from them. 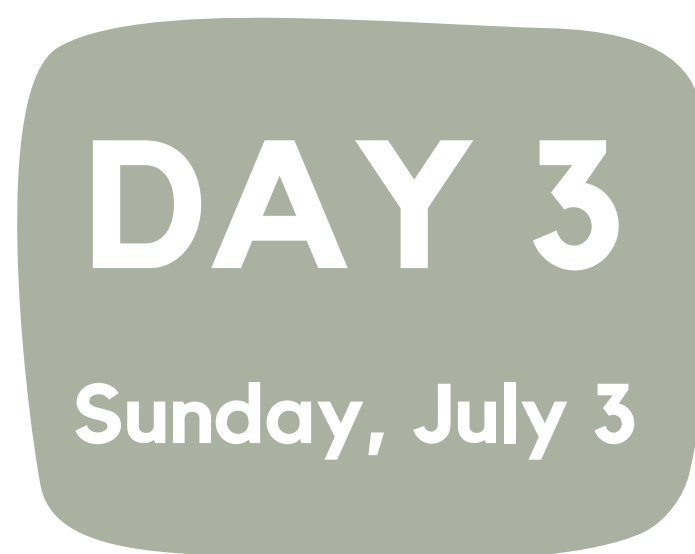

REFLECTION

EXALT CHRIST THE LORD THE SOVEREIGN

"God will bring this about in his own time. He is the blessed and only Sovereign, the King of kings, and the Lord of lords, who alone is immortal and who lives in unapproachable light, whom no one has seen or can see, to him be honor and eternal power. Amen." - 1 Timothy 6:15-16

REFLECTION

From the beginning of the Bible until the end, there is a theme shouting that God alone is sovereign. There is nothing in the universe that God does not control. Sovereign is defined as power without limit and refers to a supreme lord or ruler who possesses highest authority.

In a language that humans can comprehend, the word tells us that God counts the stars, calls them by name and with great precision determines their course.

God controls the affairs of men and nations determining the course of human history. In Daniel 4:34-35, an earthly king declares this about the Most High God, "His rule is everlasting, and his kingdom is eternal. All the people of the earth are nothing compared to him. He does as he pleases." The Lord can shatter the plans of nations and men, but his intentions will never be shattered.

Believers in Christ are part of God's plan. Long ago before we were created, God chose to love us! According to his eternal, loving plan, he carries out and sustains our salvation. 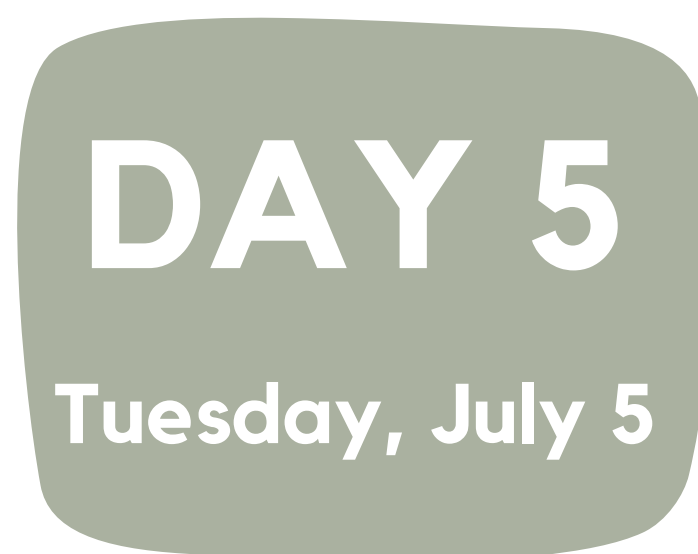
God has a good plan. He controls and works out purposes in the lives of those who believe in Jesus Christ and he will see it through!

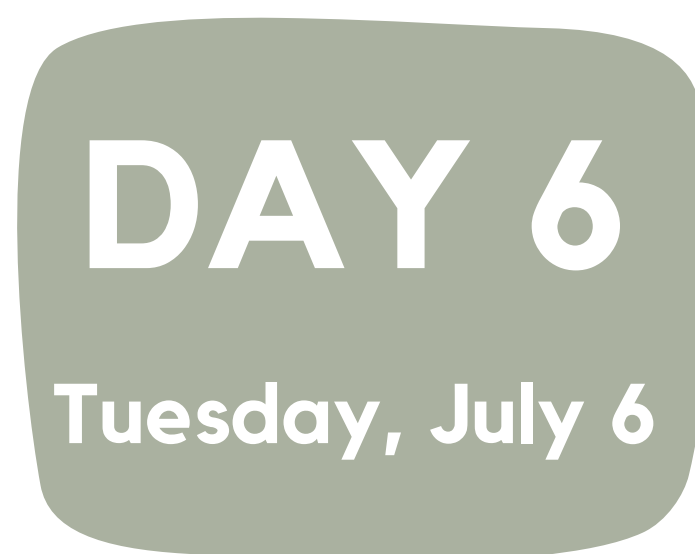

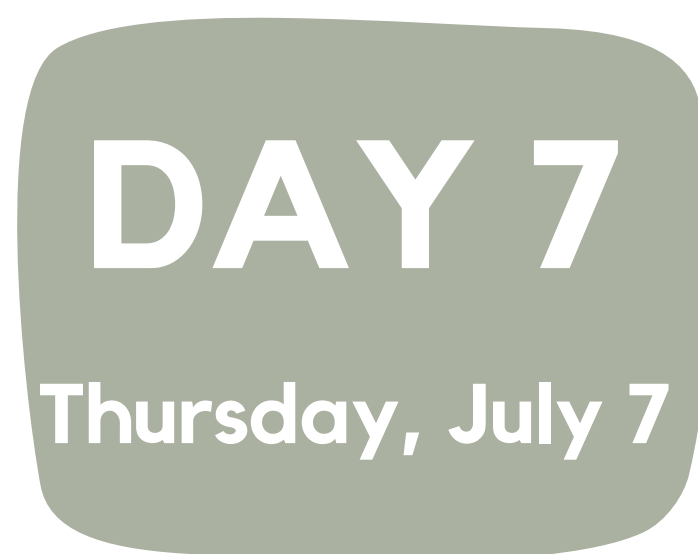
Today let's take time to worship him and exalt him as the very spoken Word of God. "He wore a robe stained with blood, and His name is the Word of God" (Rev. 19:13).

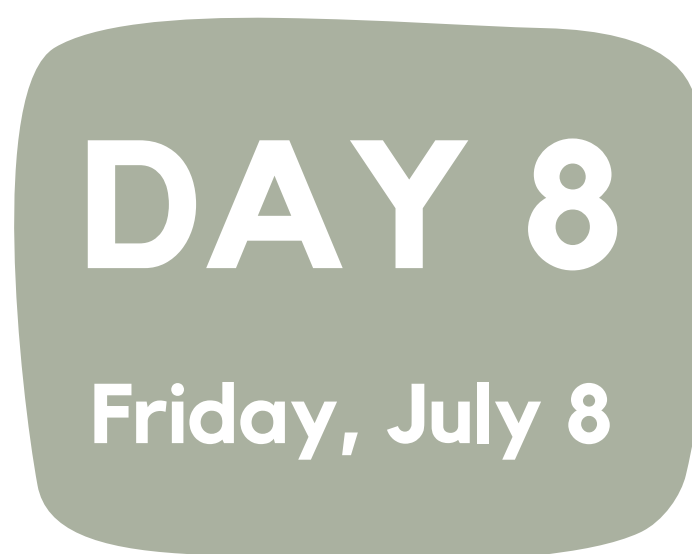

REFLECTION

Recently I heard a statement that without the sun we would not be able to sustain our physical life on earth. Well, that is certainly obvious, I thought. But we do tend to take the sun for granted. Just as we need the light of the sun for physical life, so we need Jesus, the Light of the World, to give and sustain spiritual life. Without Jesus, we would only find darkness and death.

But Jesus came to our world to give what he only can give. His light reveals God to us, restores us to relationship with God, and invites us into all things good and into the world of the living. REFLECTION

EXALT CHRIST THE LORD THE WAY, TRUTH AND LIFE

"Jesus told him, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." - John 14:6

REFLECTION

When Jesus told us he is the way, the truth and the life, he is telling us that knowing him is not only the ultimate meaning and fulfillment of life on earth, but the only way to really know our Father who is in heaven.

As the Way, Jesus makes it clear that we do not know how to know the defined way we are supposed to travel in life. Instead, we are to simply know and trust in Jesus daily. We are called to walk in faith that HE is the way. We can know that Christ our Savior will lead us exactly where we need to go as we walk with him and in him.

As the Truth, we know that Jesus testifies to the truth and teaches the truth because he himself is that truth. In him we find nothing false, nothing misleading, and nothing fake or uncertain. When we seek to figure out in life what is the truth and what is a lie, we can always measure it against the words of Jesus, who himself is the truth.

As the Life, Jesus reminds us that what we are to really be concerned with is not this life, but with eternal life – the life to come after our life on this earth. When we follow the voice of Jesus as our life, we can also know what that eternal life is in the here and now. We can choose to live in such a way that we are not chasing things that pass away, but chasing the things that last and have eternal significance.

As the Way, the Truth, and the Life, Jesus is giving us a better way to live our lives through him. When we follow him, we are led to a better, richer, more meaningful life than we could ever find on our own.

PRAYER

Christ, you are the Savior, the Way to the Father, the Truth we depend on, the Life that we need. The poor and suffering know your caring – and your mercy is broader than we as your people have often proclaimed. Today, Lord, may I, along with the peoples of North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, and Oklahoma, treasure the life that we share in your name. Turn our hearts to follow your way, know your truth, and experience your life within us. Amen.

DAY 11

Sunday, July 11

EXALT CHRIST THE LORD OUR WONDERFUL COUNSELOR

"For a child will be born for us, a son will be given to us, and the government will be on his shoulders. He will be named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Eternal Father, Prince of Peace." - Isaiah 9:6

REFLECTION

When Isaiah uses the words Wonderful Counselor to refer to the Messiah, the Christ, he indicated the kind of character the coming King has. We use the word "Wonderful" every day to mean something that is likeable, or pleasant, or lovely. Here the word wonderful literally means "incomprehensible." We know that Jesus is wonderful in a way that is boggling to our mind. Jesus, in all his ways, is even wonderful beyond our own understanding. Jesus' kind of wonderful is awe-inspiring and superior to any other kind, for he is perfect in every way.

The second part of Isaiah's expression is the word "Counselor". In my own ministry I have counseled hundreds of people, but I know that no matter how well I seek to counsel, at its best, it is imperfect. I am not always well qualified. But Jesus is the perfect and wise counselor. He is able to advise his people completely because he is qualified in ways no human counselor is. In Christ is hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge. That includes the knowledge of all human nature. Jesus always knows what we are going through. He always knows the right course of action for us to take.

Christ the Lord, as our Wonderful Counselor, means that every day we can trust him to listen to our problems and guide us in the right direction. We can be absolutely certain he has our best interests at heart because he loves us more than anyone else could ever love us. And his love is so wide and deep (and wonderful) that we cannot fully understand it. Whatever perplexes you today, you can choose to rest in him as your Wonderful Counselor.

Father, we thank you for the gift of Your Son, Jesus, our Wonderful Counselor. Thank you for being our protection and thank you for granting us counsel and wisdom when we seek your will. REFLECTION

REFLECTION

He came the first time proclaiming the Kingdom of God is near, turn from your sins, and believe this Good News! He came as the Lamb of God who would take away the sin of the world! This Lamb bears the marks of slaughter showing the truth that he has come to power through death!

This same Lamb is called the Lord of lords and the King of kings (Revelation 17:14), and in his sovereign power he leads the final battle to defeat Satan. The Lion has triumphed because of what Christ the Lamb has already accomplished! He defeated all the forces of evil by dying on the cross! Exalt his Name!

Are you weeping like John in this hour? Take courage. Jesus has overcome our enemy and all who believe in him will have eternal life!

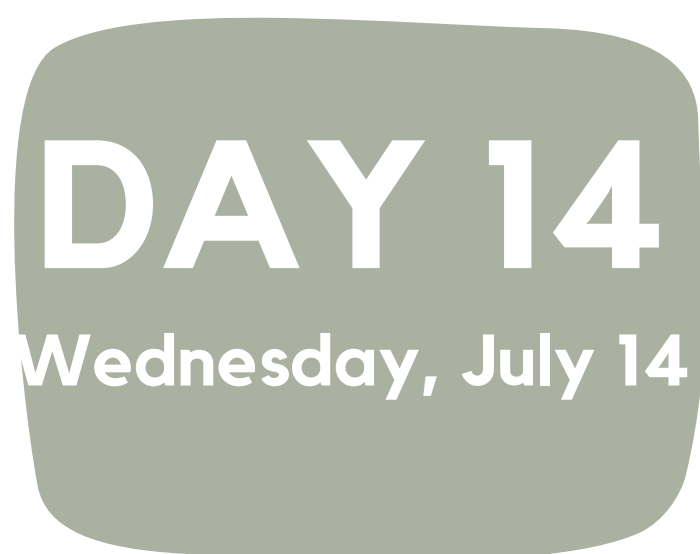
PRAYER

REFLECTION
