## LEGAL RIGHTS OF CHURCHES

### CHURCHES CAN:

- ✓ Conduct nonpartisan voter registration and get-out-the-vote activities
- ✓ Distribute nonpartisan voter guides
- ✓ Support or oppose legislation or a ballot measure
- ✓ Host a forum for political candidates where all candidates are invited

### CHURCHES CANNOT:

- ✗ Support or oppose a political candidate
- ✗ Provide a link of the church website to a candidate's campaign website
- ✗ Contribute to political candidates

## CONSIDER YOUR PLANS FOR VOTER REGISTRATION DRIVES AND VOTER GUIDE DISTRIBUTION:

- ✓ Ask permission from your church to be the point person
- ✓ Order a FREE Voter Registration Kit at 1-800-FAMILY-1. The kit offers resources and assistance to help you plan a nonpartisan drive.
- ✓ Order nonpartisan Voter Guides at pafamily.org. These guides are designed to help you cast an informed vote come November 6th.
- ✓ Use the key dates above as a guide to assist in making your plans.
