MEMORANDUM

April 29, 2015

The survey finds that 65% of registered voters in Pennsylvania oppose a law “which would allow for penalties, fines and lawsuits against individuals who refuse to provide wedding-related services to same sex couples even if their refusal is based on their strongly held religious beliefs.” A majority of voters from all political parties oppose this law (Republicans at 77%, Democrats at 56%, Independents at 62%). Furthermore, majorities of both self-identified Moderates (54% strongly oppose, 70% total oppose) and Conservatives (63% strongly oppose, 74% total oppose) strongly oppose such a law.

METHODOLOGY:

These findings are from a survey of 513 registered voters in Pennsylvania conducted April 22-27, 2015 using live operator callers to landlines and cell phones. The margin of error is +/- 4.33%.
