





2025 Pennsylvania State of Abortion Report

Pennsylvania abortions hit a 14-year high amid rising chemical abortions, failed inspections, and pro-abortion state policies.

2025 Pennsylvania State of Abortion Report

In 2020, the Pennsylvania Family Institute published its first State of Abortion Report. In five years, much has changed in the abortion outlook in the Commonwealth.

Roe v. Wade has been overturned. Josh Shapiro has been inaugurated as Pennsylvania's 48th governor. Abortion pills and telemedical abortions have reached a level of prominence never seen before. The Federal government has finally defunded Planned Parenthood.

Throughout it all, Pennsylvania has introduced no new restrictions on abortion. If anything, the state has expanded abortion in the last five years, and abortion numbers have increased. Every day, children up to 24 weeks of age are being killed in their mother's womb throughout the Commonwealth.

Key Points


1. In 2023, the last full year with complete abortion numbers, over 35,000 babies¹ were aborted in PA, an increase from 2022 and a 14-year high, continuing an alarming reversal of what was once a decrease in abortions happening within the Commonwealth.
2. Governor Josh Shapiro not only regularly mocks pro-lifers with his taxpayer-funded TikToks but has funneled taxpayer money to abortion advocates, sued to defend Planned Parenthood, and shielded abortionists who traffic dangerous abortion drugs across state lines.
3. PA abortion facilities were cited for their 600th health and building inspection infraction since 2012.
4. Reported complications from abortions in Pennsylvania have tripled in the past 6 years.² This goes hand-in-hand with the rise of chemical abortions being dispensed without medical examination or supervision to thousands of women.

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The Good News

One abortion mill and two Planned Parenthood “feeder” locations recently closed, **making it 27 abortion facilities shut down in PA since 2010.**


1. **Quakertown:** a feeder clinic in Bucks County that referred women to larger Planned Parenthood abortion mills, closed in June 2022.
2. **Warminster:** an abortion mill in Bucks County that killed more than 800 children each year and notably failed multiple health inspections, including hiding a botched abortion,³ closed in June 2024.
3. **Moon Township:** a feeder clinic in Allegheny County that referred women to larger Planned Parenthood abortion mills, closed in March 2025.

Despite adversity, defunding, and even violent attacks, pregnancy resource centers continue to provide essential, professional, and free care, including pregnancy testing, education, ultrasounds, and baby items, and they continue to **outnumber abortion clinics by 9:1.**⁴

With the passage of the Big Beautiful Bill, Planned Parenthood was defunded for one year. As a result, the largest abortion business will not receive federal Medicaid funding (your tax dollars) for one year.

The Bad News

The latest state report reveals that abortions are at a 14-year high in Pennsylvania, soaring past 35,000 children killed in the womb in 2023. That’s 97 babies aborted in Pennsylvania per day. This is a reversal of the trend of decreasing abortions throughout the 2010s.

In 2023, Planned Parenthood alone carried out **over 19,000 abortions.**

They profit from performing **half** of all abortions in Pennsylvania every year.

In 2023, **hospitals, meant to be a place where life is rescued, killed 2,636 total unborn children.** This continues the drastic increase of hospital abortions happening in PA: 2021 (1722), 2022 (2333). UPMC Magee and Einstein Hospital combined killed over 1000 unborn children

Planned Parenthood, despite closing 19 locations since 2010, has added chemical abortion services in Bensalem (2021), Wilkes-Barre (2020), and Lancaster (2023), and early reports show they are opening another location in Pittsburgh.

In 2022, the year Roe was overturned, there was a noticeable increase in abortions by women from out-of-state, particularly from Ohio and West Virginia; nearly 1,000 more abortions on women from out of state compared to the previous year. But the experience of neighboring states shows that stronger pro-life protections in law save lives.

When Ohio's Heartbeat Law went into effect after the Dobbs decision, abortions plummeted by more than 50%, from roughly 2,000 per month down to just 850. (A court order blocked this law several months later.) Meanwhile, West Virginia enacted a near-total abortion ban in 2022; over 1,300 abortions occurred in the state the previous year. Taken together, these outcomes highlight the impact pro-life state laws can have in saving lives.



Late Term Abortions

In 2023, **4,032 fully-formed, pain-capable children were killed in the womb in Pennsylvania.**

Unborn children have been proven to have the **capacity to experience pain in the second trimester**, when the child is fully formed.⁵

Second-trimester abortions often are done using a procedure known as a Dilation & Evacuation (D&E), involving the **live dismemberment of the unborn child.**


Abortionists do not administer any anesthetic to the child before his/her dismemberment.




Abortions - Disproportionately Done On Minority Babies

15,474 or 44% of 2023 abortions performed in Pennsylvania were done on black women, a gross disparity, considering that black Pennsylvanians make up only 12.4% of the Commonwealth's population.⁶ This is the highest number of black unborn children killed in 10 years.

Abortion's roots have always been in hatred and racism. Margaret Sanger, founder of Planned Parenthood, was a eugenicist who opened her first clinic in a black neighborhood in Brooklyn and targeted “inferior races” for decades.⁷


The Independence Law Center filed an amicus brief in an important Pennsylvania case on behalf of a host of nationally recognized organizations and leaders in the Black community, including Ryan Bomberger and Dr. Alveda King. “Nearly half of the next generation of Black Americans is being exterminated through racially targeted abortion. Black women have indeed been underserved—not through lack of access, but through the predatory objectives and actions of the abortion industry, especially Planned Parenthood. From its inception, the abortion industry has sought to control and hinder the growth of the Black population, a core objective of the movement’s founders.”

In our analysis, we have determined that half of abortion clinics in the Commonwealth are in minority neighborhoods, a disproportionality compared to the racial demographics of the state.

Failed Inspections



In 2011, Pennsylvania lawmakers, with then-Governor Tom Corbett, passed bipartisan abortion clinic regulations, including updated safety regulations and mandatory health inspections, finally holding clinics that perform surgical abortions to the same standard as any other surgical facility.⁸

Dayle Steinburg (President and CEO of Planned Parenthood Southeastern PA) described these regulations at the time as “composed of politically-motivated regulations on abortion centers....that did nothing to enhance our already safe and high quality services.”⁹

Planned Parenthood and other abortion facilities’ health inspections prove otherwise.

In 2025, PA abortion facilities were cited for their 600th health and building inspection infraction since 2012. PA Family Institute reported that in 2023, the majority of women who had an elective abortion did so at a facility that failed a health inspection that year. Half of PA’s abortion facilities failed a health inspection that year.¹⁰

In the last 3 years, 13 of 18 PA abortion mills (72%) failed a health inspection.

In 2025, the Philadelphia Women's Clinic, PA's largest abortion clinic, which kills over 5000 children a year (almost a thousand of which are late-term), has **failed a building safety inspection for the ninth year in a row**. They have been cited for **50 total building safety infractions** since 2013. Infractions include failing to maintain smoke detectors and sprinkler systems,¹¹ fire hazards,¹² and obstructed exits.¹³


The Philadelphia Women's Clinic has also been cited for **57 total health infractions** since 2012. Infractions include failing to obtain parental consent for multiple minors receiving abortions,¹⁴ failing to verify the licenses of nurses working in the facility,¹⁵ failing to ensure a sanitary environment for patients,¹⁶ and failing to upkeep a freezer used to store fetal remains.¹⁷


Abortion Complications Increasing

According to the Department of Health, there were 524 reported complications from abortions in 2023, 11.7% more than what was reported in 2022. This is **more than triple what they were six years ago**, and continues a trend of increasing reported abortion complications in PA since 2020.

This shocking rise in abortion complications goes hand-in-hand with Pennsylvania’s drastic increase in chemical abortions (called “medical abortions” by the abortion industry) done via the abortion pill, mifepristone.

According to mifepristone’s FDA label, roughly one out of every 22 women who take it will end up in the emergency room.¹⁸ Mifepristone has been associated with 36 deaths,¹⁹ thousands of serious adverse reactions, and upwards of 500 known life-threatening conditions.²⁰


Josh Shapiro - An Adversary to Women & Children

Reportedly using a social media staff of nine professionals and likely over \$1,000,000 per year of taxpayer dollars, Pennsylvania's Governor Josh Shapiro regularly mocks pro-lifers in dozens of TikToks he has posted on his official social media. But his pro-abortion record goes far beyond mere rhetoric. In his 3 years in office, Shapiro has implemented policies attacking women and children.

- In April 2023, using state taxpayer dollars, Josh Shapiro launched an official state government website connecting women with abortion clinics and educating them on how to pay for their abortions.²¹
- In January 2024, Josh Shapiro slashed state funding to Real Alternatives, a 30-year-old program designed to empower women to choose life for their child, and funneled the money to pro-abortion groups that encourage women to kill their own child.²²
- In July 2024, Josh Shapiro refused to defend a longstanding, bipartisan law that prohibits the state's medicaid tax dollars from being used for abortions.²³
- In July 2025, Josh Shapiro sued the Trump Administration for defunding Planned Parenthood via the Big Beautiful Bill, falsely claiming that Planned Parenthood provides prenatal care.²⁴

Planned Parenthood Finally Defunded

For many years, Planned Parenthood received millions in tax dollars. This is the same Planned Parenthood whose abortions make up 94% of their services, and who abort more than half the children in Pennsylvania killed via abortion every year

While for many years, thanks to pro-life leadership in Congress, federal medicaid dollars could not be used for abortions, they could be used for the few other services that Planned Parenthood claims to provide. **This freed up money from their overall profits to pay for abortion-related activities, including lobbying elected officials to oppose every reasonable abortion regulation and limit.** With the recent passage of the “One Big Beautiful Bill,” that finally changes.

The bill prohibits federal medicaid dollars from being used at facilities that provide abortions for one year. As a result, Planned Parenthood has announced that nearly 200 facilities across 24 states are at risk of closure.²⁶

The Pennsylvania Family Institute applauds Congress for its bold pro-life leadership and encourages lawmakers to make the defunding **permanent**.

The New Threat - Telemedicine Abortions & Shield Laws

Telemedicine

In December 2021, then-President Joe Biden's FDA reversed a long-standing requirement that women pick up their abortion pills in person. As a result, telehealth abortions have skyrocketed nationwide.

- In addition to the existing dangers associated with the abortion pill, women receiving it remotely have no proper medical examination or supervision.
- There is no opportunity for an ultrasound to confirm how old the unborn child is. If he/she is older than 12 weeks, the abortion could be incomplete. The woman could have heavy bleeding and a life-threatening infection.
- There is no opportunity to check for an ectopic pregnancy, creating false security in the woman, leaving the ectopic pregnancy untreated. When the pregnancy ruptures, the woman's life is in serious danger.

Shield Laws

Pro-Life states have attempted to fight this by restricting abortion drugs. Instead of following suit, Pennsylvania has sided against women and children. In 2022, then-Governor Tom Wolf signed an executive order known as a "Shield Law," which prohibits state agencies from assisting pro-life states in investigating abortionists who illegally traffic dangerous abortion drugs out of Pennsylvania into pro-life states. Governor Josh Shapiro has continued this policy.

- Shield laws, by definition, break the constitutional requirements of each state in the Union. Article IV, Section 1 of the United States Constitution requires each state to bear "Full Faith and Credit...to the public Acts, Records, and judicial Proceedings of every other State".

Horrorific Consequences

Not only are shield laws blatantly unconstitutional, but they also have horrific consequences.

- A 20-year-old woman in Texas and a minor in Louisiana were rushed to the hospital with life-threatening conditions after dangerous abortion drugs were trafficked to them by an out-of-state doctor in New York, a state with a similar shield law as Pennsylvania.²⁷

Using their shield law, New York has refused to hand over the abortionist who put the women in the hospital to justice.

- In 2022, **Amber Thurman**, a pregnant mother in Georgia, received and ingested abortion pills from a clinic in North Carolina (a state with abortionist shield laws). Not all of her child's tissue was expelled from the womb during the abortion, resulting in an infection that killed her. Abortion activists falsely claimed that Georgia's pro-life laws prohibited doctors from being able to intervene, but no pro-life state, including Georgia, prohibits doctors from treating life-threatening medical emergencies, miscarriages, or removing retained tissue.
- In 2022, **Candi Miller**, a pregnant mother in Georgia, ordered abortion pills online from an out-of-state doctor and ingested them without an ultrasound to confirm how old her child was. She suffered alone at home for days before passing away. An autopsy found that she had retained tissue in her uterus.
- In 2017, an abortion clinic gave New Mexico mother-to-be **Keisha Adams** abortion pills for her late-term child. She was left in a hotel room without any medical supervision before going into respiratory distress and dying from sepsis caused by the abortion. It took years, but the family was compensated \$900,000 from the abortion clinic for her death. Under shield laws, her abortionist would not be liable to give the family any compensation.
- In 2022, a Planned Parenthood in Nevada sent **Alyona Dixon** home with abortion drugs to kill her 8-week-old child. She suffered at home for four days before being sent to a hospital and discharged. Two days later, she died from sepsis.
- In 2003, **Holly Patterson** received abortion pills from a California abortionist and was instructed to self-administer them at home. After days of severe abdominal cramping, she died in the hospital from sepsis three weeks after her 18th birthday.

Every day, Governor Josh Shapiro blatantly mocks the rule of law and disregards the health and safety of women and children by continuing to protect those who illegally peddle and traffic abortion drugs.

Planned Parenthood Caught Lying (Again) About Offering Prenatal Care

A July 2025 review conducted by the Pennsylvania Family Institute found that multiple Planned Parenthood locations across the Commonwealth are advertising “Prenatal and Postpartum Services” on their websites, yet none of the listed clinics actually offer prenatal care.

Calls made directly to Planned Parenthood locations that claim to offer such services confirmed the truth: not one Planned Parenthood in Pennsylvania provides any prenatal care. This false advertising comes despite Planned Parenthood Keystone and Planned Parenthood of Western Pennsylvania listing “Prenatal and Postpartum Services” among their offerings at multiple health centers.

Planned Parenthood Keystone’s call center, which manages scheduling for several of these locations, confirmed that none of its clinics offer prenatal care. Similar confirmation was obtained from the Pittsburgh-based affiliate, Planned Parenthood of Western Pennsylvania.

Governor Josh Shapiro has also perpetuated this false narrative. In a widely circulated post on X (formerly Twitter), he claims that defunding Planned Parenthood would deny Pennsylvanians access to “essential, lifesaving care such as... prenatal and postpartum care.”²⁸ Yet as our direct investigation confirms, not a single Planned Parenthood clinic in Pennsylvania actually offers prenatal care. The Governor’s statement isn’t just misleading—it’s demonstrably false. Either he’s unaware of the facts, or he’s deliberately repeating a narrative that gives political cover to an abortion provider that continues to misrepresent its services to the public.

This isn’t the first time Planned Parenthood has been caught misleading the public in this way. In 2017, Pennsylvania Family Institute exposed that all 27 Planned Parenthood locations in the state were listing prenatal care as a service online, despite none actually offering it.²⁹ Following the exposure and media attention in 2017, Planned Parenthood quietly removed the listings from its appointment pages. However, now 8 years later, they appear to be back.

The implications are serious. Pregnant women searching for genuine prenatal care may be misled into thinking these facilities offer the support they need. Instead, they’re being referred elsewhere—or worse, funneled toward abortion services under the false premise of “prenatal care.”

Shocking Chemical Abortion Tragedy in Lancaster County

In May 2024, a teenage girl from East Donegal Township in Lancaster County made national headlines after she took abortion drugs obtained online in an attempt to kill her fully formed, 20-week-old baby. She was able to do this thanks to the Biden FDA's removal of in-person dispensing requirements for abortion pills.

The abortion was unsuccessful, and the child was born alive. The horror of this situation was compounded by the teenager's texts to a friend, revealing the shocking reality of what took place after taking the abortion pill:



“It just came out now and it’s like a full baby and it’s still moving.”
“It has fingernails, and lips, and a nose.”
“I’m scared to touch it cause it moves sometimes.”

Media reports described ‘it’ as a baby, fetus, or child; one news report used all three terms in its story. ‘It’ is a human being that this mother felt she should keep in a box and bury in her backyard.

This case underscores the grim reality of abortion pills—marketed under the guise of “women’s healthcare”—that leave women at risk of complications without medical supervision or emotional support, all while an unborn baby’s life is targeted.

The narrative of “choice” crumbles when women, left to fend for themselves, must resort to burying their own child because they were misled into believing a chemical abortion was an easy, private solution.

One leading site promoted by the abortion industry offers “next-day shipping as an option and can also ship your medications to a PO Box, UPS or FedEx pick-up locations, dorm or campus mail center—all sent in a plain padded envelope.” (source intentionally omitted)

In other words, young women can abort their baby alone in their dorm room and be left to deal with the bleeding, the medical complications, and the trauma of ending the baby’s life.
