5 EASY Steps for Voter Registration for New Voters and Ballot Requests for Already Registered Voters!

5 STEPS FOR VOTER REGISTRATION AT CHURCH

Registration Deadline
OCTOBER 20th

ASK

Get permission from your pastor and church leadership so that you're under biblical authority. When asking, emphasize that voter registration is:

Biblical: Selecting Godly leaders is rooted in biblical principle (Exod 18:21; Prof 29:2)

Simple: Federal laws have made voter reg easier than ever

Legal: The IRS says church voter-reg drives do not violate any regulations and are encouraged

PREPARE

1. Obtain iPads, laptops, and/or have people use their own phones right at the table. You can also obtain paper voter registration forms from your county elections office - mailed or collected and submitted in person.

2. Prepare links - find them at pafamily.org under the Citizen Action Center tab and at pafamily.org/choosewell

3. Print: large QR code for people to use their own phones at the tables:

On a Sunday, a few weeks before primary and general elections, have a table set up in the lobby in a high-traffic area, recruit a team of trained volunteers, and have all the resources available. Be friendly and provide assistance. Encourage folks already registered to order mail-in ballots.

LEGAL

It is legal to encourage and assist people at your church to register to vote and order their mail-in ballot. While volunteers at churches may engage in conversations about policy and candidates, the primary goal is simply to register your congregation and help them order mail-in ballots. You want to make sure your congregation does not bury their "talents" by neglecting to vote.

FOLLOW UP

In addition to voter registration, provide a signup sheet for people who need a ride to the polls and/or childcare. Encourage voters to vote by mail to avoid unplanned election-day absenteeism. And remember, Pastors are free to encourage their congregation to vote for biblical values.
